Happy November families! Each month, Warren Elementary's Math Committee will highlight one Math Resource that can be used at home to help strengthen your student's math skills. Over the past few years, some resources in Baltimore County have changed and so we want you all to be aware of what is available to help your student grow. Although student devices are not coming home at this point in the year, each of the online resources we highlight are accessible from most home computers and devices using a student's BCPS username and password.

This month we want to highlight BrainPOP and BrainPOP Jr. Students love to watch the short videos about interesting science and social studies topics, but they often forget that BrainPop has a lot of informative math videos also. This is a great way to learn new skills and review old ones in a fun way.

Students can easily access BrainPOP from Schoology by simply clicking along the right side of any of their Schoology courses. They do not need a username and password if they enter this way.

They can also access it from any computer by using -Username - baltcops Password - brainpop BrainPOP Jr covers many topics including - number sense, addition and subtraction, money, time, measurement and many more.

BrainPOP covers the topics of - two step equations, percents, fractions, percentages, square roots, angles and a lot more.

November's monthly Virtue is "Tolerance and Acceptance."

During the first week of November, students will discuss and talk about what it means to be tolerant and to accept others.

To introduce the topics, students will discuss what tolerance is and share differences they want during morning meetings. The conversation will then be extended to that the differences that we have means acceptance of oneself and the differences of others.

Tolerating is the first step, a passivity of existence. Accepting is the second step, an active expression as a community member of the school to include everyone.

In addition to tolerance and acceptance, students will discuss in later weeks helpfulness, understanding, and thankfulness, and service as extensions of tolerance and acceptance.

Students can show tolerance by sitting with new friends in the cafeteria, recognizing differences in the classroom, and standing up for friends.

Students can show acceptance by inviting friends to play with them at recess, expressing positivity to friends' differences, and spotlighting differences as characteristics worth celebrating.
